Dr. Isaac F. Adewole

Dr. Isaac F. Adewole is a gynecologist, the immediate past Minister of Health, Nigeria; former Vice Chancellor, University of Ibadan, Nigeria; and former President of Africa Organisation for Research and Training in Cancer. He is the co-founder of the African Cancer Coalition and a member of the International Taskforce on Elimination of Cervical Cancer in the Commonwealth.



Dr. Adewole has led several research projects on prevention, diagnosis, and capacity building on cervical cancer in Nigeria and Sub-Saharan Africa. He has authored more than 230 publications on topics such as cervical cancer, sexual and reproductive health and rights, abortion, HIV and Human Papillomavirus.

He has served on several national and international organizational boards and programs on research and policy for cancer control. Currently, Dr. Adewole is involved with reviewing the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Harmonized Cancer Treatment Guidelines for Sub-Saharan Africa, as well as serving on the Lancet Oncology Cancer Control in Sub-Saharan Africa Commission and Lancet Commission on Cancer and Health systems.

Dr. Ala Alwan

Dr. Alwan is Regional Director Emeritus, World Health Organization (WHO); Professor and Principal Investigator for the Disease Control Priorities 3 project at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine; and Clinical Professor of Global Health, University of Washington, USA.



He held several senior leadership positions at the WHO, including Assistant Director-General for Noncommunicable Diseases and Mental Health, Assistant Director-General and Representative of the Director-General for Emergencies and Health Action in Crises, and Director of the Department of Noncommunicable Diseases. He was also Regional Director of the WHO Eastern Mediterranean Region.

Dr. Alwan was a Professor of Medicine and Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, Mustansiriyah University, Baghdad, Iraq. He also served as Iraq's Minister of Education and Health from 2003-2005 and Minister of Health and Environment from 2018-2019.



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Dr. Fatima Cardoso

Dr. Cardoso is Director of the Breast Unit of the Champalimaud Clinical Center, the first certified breast unit in Portugal. Previously, she was an Assistant Professor at the Medical Oncology Clinic of the IJB for 10 years and served as the scientific director of the international research network TRANSBIG.



Dr. Cardoso is the founder and President of the Advanced Breast Cancer (ABC) Global Alliance and of the ABC International Consensus Guidelines Conference. She is also editor-in-chief of *The Breast Journal*, associate editor of the *European Journal of Cancer*, and an editorial board member of several other journals.

Among several awards, Dr. Cardoso received the prestigious Order of Santiago da Espada for Scientific Merit from the president of Portugal and the 2020 European Breast Cancer Science Award - Emmanuel van der Schueren Lecture. She has authored approximately 300 publications and presents her work nationally and internationally.

Her research interests include biology of breast cancer, prognostic and predictive markers of response to systemic therapy, and new anticancer agents. She is actively involved in many phase I-IV breast cancer clinical trials.

Dr. Robert W. Carlson

Dr. Robert W. Carlson is Chief Executive Officer of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN). He joined NCCN as CEO in January 2013 following several leadership positions within the organization including, most notably, Representative to the NCCN Board of Directors, Chair of the Breast Cancer Guidelines Panel, Member and Founding Chair of the Breast Cancer Risk Reduction Guidelines Panel, and Chair of the Survivorship Guidelines Panel.



Before joining NCCN, Dr. Carlson was a Professor of Medicine in the Division of Oncology and Stanford Medical Informatics at Stanford University Medical Center, as well as Medical Director of Inpatient Oncology and Hematology at the Stanford Cancer Institute.

A member of several medical societies, Dr. Carlson lectures extensively and has authored or co-authored more than 140 articles, abstracts, and book chapters in publications such as *Journal of the National Cancer Institute*, *Journal of Clinical Oncology*, and *The Breast Journal*. He has served as Associate Editor of *Oncology* and *JNCCN - Journal of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network*.



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Dr. Julie Gralow

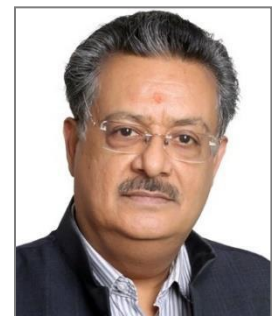
Dr. Julie Gralow is Executive Vice President and Chief Medical Officer for the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO). She is a breast medical oncologist who served more than 25 years as Professor of Medical Oncology, Adjunct Professor of Global Health, and Director of Breast Medical Oncology at the University of Washington School of Medicine, Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center, and Seattle Cancer Care Alliance.



Dr. Gralow has extensive experience in conducting cancer clinical trials. Within the SWOG Cancer Research Network, she served as Executive Officer for Breast and Lung Cancer and Vice Chair of the Breast Cancer Committee. She chaired the recent ASCO Academic Global Oncology Task Force and has co-chaired the ASCO Resource Stratified Guideline Advisory Group. She received the ASCO Humanitarian Award in 2018 for her work in empowering women cancer patients globally.

Dr. Hemant Malhotra

Dr. Hemant Malhotra is Professor and Head, Department of Medical Oncology at the Sriram Cancer Center of the Mahatma Gandhi College Hospital in Jaipur, India. He has more than three decades of government service as Senior Professor and Head, Department of Medicine and Head of the Division of Medical Oncology at the Birla Cancer Center, SMS Medical College, where he established a bone marrow transplantation unit.



An oncology advisor and committee member for several organizations, including the Indian government, Dr. Malhotra is Immediate Past President of the Indian Society of Medical & Pediatric Oncology and a founder and Head of the Hematological Cancers Committee of the Indian Cooperative Oncology Network.

In recognition of his professional contributions, Dr. Malhotra received the International Chronic Myeloid Leukemia Prize for outstanding work in CML in an emerging region. He was the Chair and a speaker at the 62nd Annual Conference of the American Society of Hematology in 2019.

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Rajeev Nannapaneni

Rajeev Nannapaneni has been the Vice Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Natco Pharma Limited (NATCO) since June 2012. He joined the India-based generics pharmaceutical company in 2000 as a Business Development Manager, holding positions of increasing responsibility, including Chief Operating Officer, until taking the chief executive role.

Under Mr. Nannapaneni's stewardship, NATCO has built a strong generics portfolio, including APIs and formulations in the oncology segment. NATCO has a leadership position in making generic versions of Imatinib, Anastrozole, Sorafenib, Erlotinib and Zoledronic acid.



Dr. Felipe Roitberg

Dr. Roitberg is a clinical oncologist at the Hospital Sirio Libanes in São Paulo, Brazil, and a World Health Organization (WHO) consultant for cancer management and control. Currently, he is involved with economics for healthcare analysis, including an ongoing systematic review on financial toxicity for cancer patients in partnership with the WHO and the International Agency for Cancer Research (IARC).

Dr Roitberg completed his clinical oncology fellowship at the Hospital Israelita Albert Einstein, Sao Paulo, in 2011. He also had the opportunity to educate himself in the public health field while following credits in Healthcare Management, Quality for Healthcare Services and Economics for healthcare organizations at Harvard School of Public Health. He has worked with clinical research, patients' assistance and mentoring medical oncology residents in the ICESP/University of Sao Paulo for 10 years. He is also an active member and alumni of the UICC Young Leadership Program and a member of the Brazilian Society of Clinical Oncology International Affairs Board. Dr Roitberg is a member of the ESMO Global Policy Committee and the ESMO Magnitude of Clinical Benefit Scale (ESMO-MCBS) extended Working Group, a platform to support cancer medicines benefit analysis.



He is a peer reviewer for *Journal of Global Oncology* and *Frontiers in Oncology*, and joined the editorial board of the *Journal of Cancer Policy*. He also served as a reviewer for the 2020 WHO *Report on Cancer*.

Kees Roks is Head of the European Oncology Business at Novartis Pharma, Switzerland. He leads more than 2,000 dedicated associates in 51 countries on the journey to reimagine medicines.
